# The Moodji Futures Dinner with Costa Georgiadis, Paul West & Eastwoods Deli and Food, Forest and Friends Workshops:

Celebrate International Permaculture Day with an evening's exploration of local, national, and international efforts addressing climate change, care-for-country and community resilience with Costa Georgiadis of ABC's Gardening Australia. Featuring local produce, The Moodji Futures Dinner will be MC'd by Paul West (ABC South East; River Cottage AU) and will be catered for by long time Moodji supporter, Kelly Eastwood of Eastwoods Deli and Master Chef fame.

Marking Costa's seventh annual visit of local sustainability projects, the event also coincides with a regional tour of activist and singer/songwriter, Eugenio 'Ego' Lemos and his East Timorese choir. Costa and Ego will have just attended the national Permaculture Convergence in Adelaide.

The Koru Lian 'the voice and sound of' Timor Choir will sing-in the evening prior to Ego, Paul and Costa profiling efforts in social, economic & ecological innovation. With the generous support of Bermagui Surf Life Saving Club and the Federal Government's Black Summer Bushfire Fund the discussion will also showcase the nation-wide insights of Danielle Griffin, Philanthropic Services Manager of the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal. Bringing a local voice to the table, Richelle



Jackson of The Good Dairy Co will also share her family's aspiration to model 'beyond sustainable' land management, animal care and regenerative industry.

Then on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May, 10am- 3pm, join Costa at our Moodji Farm as he co-presents a range of hands on workshops. Join Costa as he co-facilitates a range of hands-on workshops on Saturday 6th May at Moodji Farm, Young St (behind the preschool). Commencing at 10am Costa will join Darren Martin who returns from the Sydney Royal Botanic Gardens for a morning of food forestry design and the mass planting out of select bushtucker and bio-accumulation species.

Wrapping up around midday participants will share in a simple veggie soup of Moodji veggies with rolls provided by long time project supporter, Honorbread Bakery. At 12:30pm Deb Gough from Schoolhouse Farm, keeper & breeder of quality heritage chickens and Cheryl Nelson, from Natural Chicken Health, producer of Super Mash & voice of 'Chook Chat', combine forces to chat about caring for backyard chickens, the choosing breeds for various contexts, plus incorporating chooks into a permaculture set-up.

Then at 1:30pm, Jo Saccomani, expert pallet breaker & maker from Two Sheds Workshop will then guide work shoppers through the world of pallet de-construction and project design. To conclude, Fraser Bayley of Old Mill Road Farm and Dan Bakker will deliver a roaming Q&A session at 2:30pm. Along with Costa they will share veggie growing tips and troubleshoot home garden issues.

#### Changes to CCS from July 2023

Child Care Subsidy (CCS) is changing from July. Most families using childcare will get more subsidy. Some families previously not eligible for CCS will now get it. Help your families understand what's changing by displaying this poster and factsheet at your service. Families can stay up to date by:

# Gap fee payments from July

From 1 July 2023, you must pay the gap fee using electronic means.

Electronic funds transfer, or EFT, is when a customer pays a bill using electronic means. Typical EFT payment methods include:

- bank or credit card, including mobile wallets
- direct deposit or bank transfer, including PayID
- online payment systems through third party software
- BPAY or Centrepay.

Most families already use EFT to pay their gap fee. If you cannot use EFT, you might be eligible for Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS). ACCS may cover all of a child's childcare fees. The Australian Government also provides support to individuals and families navigating financial crises, stress or hardship. Check out the following free, confidential support services:

- Emergency Relief
- Commonwealth Financial Counselling
- Financial Resilience programs, including No Interest Loans Scheme and Saver Plus
- Escaping Violence Payment
- Temporary Visa Holders Experiencing Violence Pilot.
